NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is Hereby Given the Santa Barbara Local Agency Formation Commission will conduct a public hearing to receive written protests against the Quail Run Reorganization: Annexation to the City of Santa Maria and Detachments from the Santa Barbara County Fire Protection District and the Mosquito and Vector Management District of Santa Barbara County. The Commission's Executive Officer will conduct the hearing.

Due to errors in the public notice provided for a protest hearing held on October 5, that hearing was invalid. It is necessary to hold a new hearing for registered voters and landowners in the annexation area who wish to submit written protests if they oppose the Quail Run Reorganization.

Any protests that were previously mailed or submitted against this annexation are not valid and will not be counted. To ensure a protest is valid, it is necessary to file a new protest.

- 1. This reorganization was initiated by the by the City Council of the City of Santa Maria on November 21, 2006 and approved by LAFCO on September 6, 2007.
- 2. The proposal area consists of approximately 63 acres located north of and adjacent to Santa Maria Way at its intersection with College Drive, just east of SR 101.
- 3. The purposes of this proposal are to provide municipal services for the proposed 22-acre Orcutt Plaza and the existing residential uses.
- 4. The public hearing will be held Thursday, December 6, 2007 at 11:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors Hearing Room, Betteravia Government Center, 511 East Lakeside Parkway, Santa Maria, California. At that time and place any protests, objections, testimony or evidence made be presented or filed in person.
- 5. It is not necessary to attend the hearing to protest the reorganization. Protests submitted by mail count as much as protests made in person.
- 6. To be valid a protest must be a signed and dated, delivered or postmarked not later than December 6, 2007; not faxed or emailed, state if protesting as a registered voter, a landowner or both; a registered voter protest must include your residential address; a landowner protest must include your Assessor Parcel Number or other description to identify the land or interest that is owned.
