

Assembly Bill 361 Determination

1) Receive and file a report on Disbursements for March and April 2022.

Changes of Organization

- 1) Consider approval of LAFCO application File No. 19-09 regarding the property located in the unincorporated area of Santa Barbara County at the southwest corner of Patterson Avenue and Calle Real to be annexed to the Goleta Sanitary District, Annexation No. 380, the "Galileo Pisa Annexation." Adoption of a Resolution includes the following actions:
 - a. Find that the Commission has considered the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared by the County of Santa Barbara as Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq., for the Galileo Pisa Apartments Rezone and General Plan Amendment Project;

- b. Condition approval upon the annexed territory being liable for any existing indebtedness and authorized taxes, charges, fees and assessments of the Goleta Sanitary District;
- Find the subject territory is uninhabited; all affected landowners have given written consent and the annexing agency has given written consent to the waiver of conducting authority proceedings; and;
- d. Waive the conducting authority proceedings and direct the staff to complete the proceeding.

- 2) Continued from April 7, 2022 Consider recommendations regarding the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023, as follows
 - a) Review the Proposed Budget for FY 2022-2023, accept all public testimony and approve the Proposed Budget;
 - b) Direct staff to distribute the approved Proposed Budget to cities, special districts and the County as required by Government Code Section 56381; and
 - c) Schedule a public hearing for June 2, 2022 to consider and adopt the Final Budget.
- 3) Consider recommendations regarding payroll service options and direct staff accordingly, or delegate authority to Executive Officer to sign Professional Service Agreement with Payroll Vault to provide Payroll Services consistent to the terms set forth in the Payroll Vault proposal dated April 20, 2022, for a cost of \$186.00 per pay period; Labor Law Poster Package for \$88.00/year; set up fee of \$99.00 and other miscellaneous fees for issuing W-2's.
