OUT-OF-AGENCY SERVICE AGREEMENT

LOCATION

4510 Via Clarice, Santa Barbara (APN 153-234-018)

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the Goleta Sanitary District to provide sewer service outside its boundaries to an existing single family home and guest

house.

GENERAL ANALYSIS:

1. Present and Future Land Use, District Boundaries and Public Services

The property where service is requested (4510 Via Clarice) is located within the District Sphere of Influence and is contiguous to the existing District boundary.

This one acre parcel is designated residential on County plans and is zoned residential. It contains a single-family home and a guest house. No change in land use is proposed as a result of the out-of-agency service extension.

The District states "This is an emergency situation because the property is being served by a private failing septic system." On December 22, 1011 the County Public Health Department issued to the Jewkes Family Trust a "Notice to Correct Substandard Septic system" for this property noting a "Failed disposal field."

The District indicates an application to annex the property will be submitted in the near future, however, given the current situation the landowner prefers immediate connection to the District sewer system. The property will be connected via a lateral to the existing sewer main in Via Clarice.

2. LAFCO Approval is Required

LAFCO regulates boundary changes and extensions of service without boundary changes. Government Code §56133 states that "A city or district may provide new or extended services by contract or agreement outside of its jurisdictional boundaries only if it first requests and receives written approval from the commission."

It provides further that LAFCO ". . . may authorize a city or district to provide new or extended services outside its jurisdictional boundaries but within its sphere of influence in anticipation of a later change of organization."

3. Existing Commission Policy Regarding Out-of-Agency Services vs. Annexations

Commission policy states that annexations to cities and special districts are generally preferred for providing services; however, out-of-agency service agreements can be an appropriate alternative.

While each proposal must be decided on its own merits, the Commission may favorably consider such agreements where "Emergency or health related conditions mitigate against waiting for annexation." This proposal appears to meet this standard.

4. Landowner Consent to Annex in order to Receive Sewer Service

Commission policy states when property may ultimately be annexed to a city or district, approval of an out-of-agency service agreement should require the landowner to agree to annex the territory with a recorded consent to annex. The District has advised our office that landowner consent for annexation has been obtained.

5. Environmental Impact of the Proposal

The District prepared a Notice of Exemption pursuant to CEQA Guideline section 15319, "Annexations of Existing Facilities" for service to this property

ALTERNATIVES FOR COMMISSION ACTION

After consideration of this report and any testimony or additional materials that are submitted the Commission should consider taking one of the following options:

Option 1 APPROVE the request with specific terms and conditions.

- 1. Find the out-of-agency service agreement to be categorically exempt.
- 2. Authorize the Goleta Sanitary District to provide sewer service to the property subject to the following terms and limitations:
 - A. LAFCO's approval applies to both current and future property owners.
 - B. Service is approved only for existing structures and facilities.
 - C. Approval to extend services beyond those specifically noted herein is withheld and is subject to future LAFCO review.

Option 2 DENY the request and require continued service by an on-site septic system.

Option 3 CONTINUE the item to obtain additional information.



Notice to Correct Substandard Septic System

SUBJECT: Septic System Located at 4510 Via Clarice, Santa Barbara

As required by the Chapter 29 of the Santa Barbara County Code, Environmental Health Services is in receipt of a Septic Tank Inspection Report dated 12/15/2011 and 10/18/2010 for the on-site sewage disposal system located on your property noted above. The code requires that copies of these reports be provided to the owner and to this office for review whenever a septic tank is pumped in the unincorporated area of the County. The code also requires this office to notify property owners of required corrections or upgrades.

The report for this septic system notes the condition(s) checked below that may constitute a danger to public health and safety; may impair proper operation and maintenance of the system; and fail to meet the standards of the Santa Barbara County Code. Please be advised, if sewer service is available within 200 feet, homeowners must connect to the sanitary sewer when any changes to their septic system require a permit. This requirement applies to items #1-5, 7 and 8 possibly #6 depending upon necessary septic system modifications.

The County Code specifies that the repair(s) / upgrade(s) required by this notice must be completed under permit and inspection from Environmental Health Services within thirty (30) days of this notice. Permits must be signed by Environmental Health Services before work is started. Unless there is an emergency, our office must be notified at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance for inspection appointments prior to any tank destruction. Necessary work must be completed by a contractor with a valid license for sanitation systems (C-42), plumbing (C-36) or engineering (A). General contractors or handymen are not licensed for this type of work.

Enclosed is an application for the necessary permit. The permit fee for a repair is \$192.00. The permit fee for an abandonment is \$310.00 and the permit fee for a modification of a system is \$410.00. The permit fee for a new system is \$820.00. Please return the completed permit application with the permit fee to our Santa Barbara office, Attn: Septic System Inspection Program, as soon as possible in order to complete the necessary corrections in the time period allotted by the County code. If this work has already been completed or if you believe this notice is in error, please contact me as soon as possible at (805) 681-4941.

Proper operation and maintenance of your septic system will prolong its useful life, enhance safety and help protect the quality of our water resources. Your cooperation is appreciated. If you have any questions about this notice, please call our Santa Barbara office.
