
- CKH Act Requires Update of SOI for a jurisdiction every five years

Key Determinations

- All eleven of the Independent Special Districts (Carpinteria Cemetery, Goleta Cemetery, Guadalupe Cemetery, Lompoc Cemetery, Los Alamos Cemetery, Oak Hill Cemetery, Santa Maria Cemetery, EMID, Lompoc Healthcare District, Santa Barbara Mosquito & Vector Control District, & Isla Vista CSD) have a Sphere of Influence that match their district boundaries
- Five Cities have Spheres of Influence that extend beyond their service boundaries: Carpinteria, Lompoc, Santa Barbara, Santa Maria and Solvang.
- The Cities of Buellton, Goleta, and Guadalupe have a coterminous Spheres.
- The recommended Sphere of Influence would maintain existing boundaries for eleven (11) agencies.

5 Changes Not Recommended Cont.

#15

Revised page 356 paragraph 1 first sentence to read “spans 6,661 acres,... ~~with the remaining jurisdictional acreage consists of public right-of-ways~~ of which 3,439 acres are owned by government agencies including the Federal Prison (2,363 acres), Allan Hancock College, county, and city.”

Change Not Recommended.
Redundant change made to page 355.
Sentence relates to property acreage versus ROW.

#16

Revised page 356 paragraph 2 first sentence note “that the northern portion of the city is government land, a portion owned by Allan Hancock College and the US Federal Penitentiary.”

Change Not Recommended.
Prior paragraph notes ownership of Allan Hancock College and the US Federal Penitentiary. Redundancy not required.

#17

Revised page 357 paragraph 1 first sentence to read “According to the Department of Finance over **2000 (43,284) to 2010 (43,079) to 2020 (43,599)** the population of Lompoc has increased **between 300 and 520** people.”

Change Not Recommended.
Department of Finance source not consistent with population figures used throughout the MSR reporting. These sources include US Census and SBCAG reporting for prior years. DOF used only for current 2025 year.
