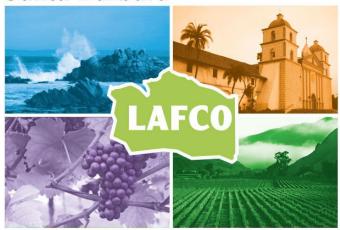

- 1) Consider recommendations regarding LAFCO application file No. 23-02 for an Out-of-Agency Service Agreement for the City of Santa Maria to provide potable water service to Ray Mutual Water Company located at Betteravia Road between Rayville Lane and A Street, in unincorporated area of Santa Barbara County west of the City of Santa Maria, CA 93456 (Betteravia Road right-of-way, APNs 111-030-005, -006, -007, -008, -009, -011, -012, -013, & 111-040-010), and consider approval of an Agreement that includes the following actions and determinations:
 - a) Find that the Commission has considered the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared by the City of Santa Maria as Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.,

for the Ray Water Company Consolidation Project SP2021-0008;

- b) The Commission finds the service request to be in the best interests of the affected area. The Commission finds that the new potable water service to be provided responds to an existing threat to the health or safety of the public or residents of the affected territory;
- c) The landowner shall comply with all terms and conditions set forth in the Commission's resolution of approval, including the landowners shall execute and record an agreement approved by the Executive Officer that consents to any future annexation of the territory, which agreement shall enure to and bind all successors in interest to the property; and
- d) Said Out-of-Agency Service Agreement is for potable water service only and shall remain in effect until such time as an annexation is approved by the Commission.
